

### 1. DAF / DAZ

*"The classic language instruction"*

#### Content

Focus on grammar and vocabulary according to CEFR

#### Key Features

- Internal assessment test for course placement
- Individual detailed feedback on language abilities
- Regular re-assessment of students' abilities
- Grade for course appears in student transcripts

#### Course Structure

DaZ 1	ca. B1 - B2	4 hrs / week
DaZ 2	ca. B2 - C1	4 hrs / week
DaZ 3	ca. C1+	2 hrs / week

### 2. CURRICULAR SUPPORT COURSE

*"Methods & more for success"*

#### Content

- Focus on interdisciplinary methods & competencies
- Working through individual student difficulties
- Discussing challenging linguistic aspects of school assignments

#### Key Features

- Tailored to immediate student academic needs
- Course takes place of 2nd foreign language periods
- Course placement based on grade level

#### Course Structure

Grade 9	3 hrs / week
Grade 10	4 hrs / week

### 3. ABITUR PREP COURSE

*"Abitur up close"*

#### Content

- Linguistic elements necessary for Abitur
- Preparation of Abitur relevant topics in school subject German
- Completion of sample Abitur exercises

#### Key Features

- Taught by German teacher with extensive experience
- Participation for students is free of charge

#### Course Structure

Abi Prep - Grade 11	1 hrs / week
Abi Prep - Grade 12	1 hrs / week

### 4. BREAK COURSES

*"German classes without distractions"*

#### Content

- Combination of cultural excursions and class sessions
- Completion of individual report for school subject of choice with linguistic, methodical support from DaZ staff

#### Key Features

- Course takes place off campus –taught by DaZ staff
- Improve grades in school subject of choice with evaluation by teacher from that subject
- Experience German culture, heritage and history up close through excursions
- Required for all students through grade 10

#### Course Structure

Fall Break in October	4 - 5 days
Carnival Break in March	4 - 5 days

### 5. GERMAN OUTSIDE OF CLASS

*"Learning by doing"*

#### Summary

Promoting integration and creating scenarios in students' free time in which German can be practiced in a fun and engaging manner.

#### Key Features

- Concept for student integration
- Offer of language-intensive clubs, *e.g. Theater, Philosophy, Museum Pedagogy, Roll Playing Games, Book Club*
- Student-created library to encourage reading
- Celebration of international holidays with student presentations

### 6. LANGUAGE AWARENESS IN CLASS

*"Learning German in every subject"*

#### Summary

Supporting teachers of all subjects in how to structure class to foster language and subject content learning simultaneously.

#### Key Features

- Close collaboration between linguistic expertise of DaZ staff and disciplinary expertise of teachers.
- In-house workshops for teachers
